have studies and tests to help us to determine our spiritual gifts. According to Wikipedia "a spiritual gift is an endowment or extraordinary power given by the Holy Spirit. These are the supernatural graces which individual Christians need to fulfill the mission of the church." Romans 12:3-8 and 1 Corinthians 12 make it clear that each Christian is given gifts according to the **Lord's choice.** We may not think we have the gift of evangelism, but God commands ALL Christians to witness and disciple. There are so many opportunities to serve, we must be on

guard not to miss an opportunity just because we are old or we have already served in the past.

I know that **Begging** is not a spiritual gift, but I think it falls under **Fortitude**. It seems that I am always offering opportunities for service with the Primetime Ministries. I am praying for a Bible Study group to adopt our Brookdale Ministry. We need someone who plays the piano and about 6 others to sing and do a devotional. We meet at 10:30 on the third Tuesday each month. The Pilgrims of Faith class adopted Hilltop at 10:30 also and then afterwards we all go to lunch. Ruth Spradling and her group have been serving Alpine for years. I have had people tell me that they don't want to think about Nursing homes. Believe me. they are not depressing and the residents are wonderful. We receive more of the blessings than our attendees.

Currently, I am in my sixth year as Director after agreeing to take it on for one year. I have enjoyed my role, but this will be my last year as Director. I believe God has someone else with fresh ideas that lives closer to the church. Join me in prayer that God will send the right person to replace me. I have a favorite book that has beautiful stories about songs! It is *Then Sings My Soul* by Robert Morgan. This book has hundreds of Hymns with stories about how they came to be written or sometimes about the effect the song had on a person's life.

I don't know about you, but I usually have a song floating in my mind all the time. Even though I don't sing well and often can't carry a tune—I have a song in my head that is in perfect pitch and beautiful! So, no wonder these past weeks with the thunder rolling and rains soaking our parched Hill Country, that my head was full of *Showers of Blessings*.

The story in my "favorite book" was about an Air Force pilot being shot down over Vietnam and spending 7 years in a wretched POW concentration camp. Alone, cold, hungry and often tortured, he kept his sanity by recalling memories from his Sunday School days in Tulsa, Oklahoma. One dark night during the monsoon rains, he was suddenly humming, then singing, a long-forgotten song of his childhood. "Showers of blessings, showers of blessing we need. Mercy drops round us are falling, but for the showers we plead".

Lt. Howard Rutledge survived those years of imprisonment and he said this song written by Major Daniel Whittle in 1883 and based on Ezekiel 34:26, "lifts us with the happy assurance of God's increasing blessing on our lives, even during our worst days".

Hopefully the showers of blessings we have had lifted you, refreshed you and helped you to feel God's loving-care over you through the good days and during the worst days.











