I saw a question on social media recently that started me thinking about why we do certain things. It asked, “Do any of you make your bed every day?” My quick mental response was, “Yes, of course I do.” Then I started thinking that maybe many people **do not** make their beds every day. Then the thought, why do I? That was easy to answer. As a child and teenager, I was taught to do so. Before leaving for school, beds were made and breakfast dishes rinsed. My thought continued on about other things I was taught—be kind, share, be honest, help others, do homework, and go to church every Sunday. I realized how fortunate I was to grow up in a home that had rules and taught goodness. As life went on, of course, I didn’t always reflect the tenets of my youth—but the foundation was always there. And due to that I came to know and love the Lord. Those of us that grew up in a Christian home are fortunate indeed and may God continue to help us in our responsibility to show His love to our world that seems to flow without rules and goodness.

I am always delighted and amazed to learn of special interest of WOW ladies. This month I’ll highlight two of them: **Jody McCulley and Ginny Walker.**

**Jody McCulley** started and is supervising an after school-tutoring program at the Doyle School Community Center. Each Monday through Thursday she has 3-4 Schreiner students come to the center to tutor 6-10 children, ages 6-13 years old. Most of the volunteers from Schreiner are from a Sports Management class doing community outreach. This group changes from time to time, which is a challenge for Jody and the children to discover who works best with whom.

After homework is completed the children can then go outside to play basketball under the covered pavillion, soccer in the yard or play on the jungle gym.

Jody and helpers are also re-organizing resource materials, games and toys from a previous after school program. She makes sure the children have a healthy fruit snack with protein like peanut butter or cheese with crackers.

Since this is a private non-profit group, cultural activities can be addressed. During the holidays the Christmas story was read and told. The same will be done at Easter with stories and activities—after they complete their homework!

Jody and her volunteers are working to emphasize teamwork, sharing, manners, good hygiene, nutrition and good study habits.

She asked us to pray for this program to continue and increase in numbers of children served.

Jody says she is having a good time supervising this non-profit after school program and contributions for snacks would be welcomed! These children eat a lot.

**Ginny Walker** shared that sometimes God has a way of blessing us when we least expect it with unconditional love from dogs, people or things that come across our paths. The secret is to recognize it and take action when God calls. One such event began after the Llano flood and the call for an adoptive/foster home for one of three Pyrenees/Boxer mix pups came in. Ginny answered the call and ended up taking all three. Ginny recognized immediately that the size and disposition of these dogs would make exceptional service dogs. She made inquiries and the 3 pups, now 6 ½ months old, will be accepted at 12 months old into the K-9 unit of Warriors Heart Recovery Center in Bandera, Texas.

Ginny is providing the care and right environment for these puppies until they reach the age of acceptance into the service dog program. She admits the challenge of caring for 3 big pups has been difficult at times: but knowing Mickey, Ladybug and Lucky Charm were rescued by her from being sent to a kill shelter warms her heart and she praises God for the wisdom (James 1:5) she drew from in saying “Yes, I’ll take all three”.




**Coconut Oil**
