In the spring of 2015 the Trinity Prime Time Choir took a trip to Arkansas to do a singing tour at several churches. At one church where they were fed supper before singing, Sue Stewart and Marvene Wallace became acquainted with one of the members, a lady who belonged to that church's sewing group. She told the two about the ministry of this sewing group; making dresses and boys shorts for missionaries and children's homes. She also showed them a storage room with packaged clothing ready to send out. Two hearts were touched and an idea was shared. "We think we could do this back at our church". After several conversations a first planning meeting was scheduled to "get their feet on the ground" and see how much interest there would be. On September 3, 2015, eleven Trinity ladies met, excited to serve in this new ministry. The ministry took off and has been going strong and growing for five years. Of the eleven original sewers, two are still with the group-Sue Stewart and Rita McFaddin. Two and a half years ago the ladies decided on a name and

The sewing group now has five different styles of dresses the ladies can choose to sew from. We have added girls shorts sets along with the boys sets being made. We make the shoe bags for the First Blessing shoe give away and this year several stitchers helped make face masks for the church family and for our local first responders and medical personnel. Also from time to time lap robes are sewn and quilted to be given to homebound and nursing home patients.

From the first meeting until present time over 2300 dresses and short sets have been sewn and sent locally and to other countries. We love this special ministry in which to serve and use our talents to help meet the needs of others. What a great group of which to be a part!



Will Reid: From my side of it, I am excited to have the opportunity to try to compete. I am blessed with kids who have some great God given talent to run and I want so badly for them to be able to complete the season and use that talent, especially the seniors. BUT, that being said, I completely understand that there is more to life than athletics and it is my belief that all of this is (and I want to say this carefully) a wake-up call from the Good Lord that we can do nothing without Him and we need to get back to putting Him first. And I say that about me first and foremost and then our school, our community, our State, our Nation and our world. I tell my kids all the time that life is longer than high school.

<u>Vern & Crystal Stahl</u>: Teachers are back in the buildings preparing our rooms for students to arrive. We are being trained on COVID safety protocols. We are training for both in person and virtual teaching. We are excited to be back in school but a little anxious about all the changes.

I've always enjoyed interacting with them, giving high-fives and fist bumps, now it will be air high-fives and air fist bumps. I'll miss the connection.

"Let God's promises shine on your problems."

"If you look at the world, you'll be distressed. If you look within you'll be depressed. But if you look at Christ, you'll be at rest."

#### Thoughts from the Bedside as shared by Roslyn Houghton

November 19, 2016 a broken femur began a journey of surgeries, rehab, and seemingly unending recovery for Roslyn Houghton. Following surgery & facing physical therapy she felt incapable of the tasks being asked of her, Roslyn called out; "Lord, I don't think I can do this". God brought three thoughts to her mind;

- Be still and know that I am God
- You have divine appointments with people you would not otherwise meet
- My grace is sufficient for you

Roslyn describes God's grace like manna, you must use all of it every day, tomorrow God will provide more grace sufficient for the day.

This season of life has been a mission trip for which she did not sign up. Roslyn found opportunities to share Jesus with other patients, physical therapists, and medical staff. Matt Riordan, physical therapist and Trinity member, has helped her through many days of PT.

Eight months after surgery she was still in pain and walking with a cane. Then came a day when she could not stand or walk. November 9, 2017 she was heading into surgery again, this time in Houston. The result would leave one leg shorter than the other.

In July 2018 she had healed, rang the bell, said no thank you to the surgery that would lengthen her leg. She felt the necessity of a lift for her shoe was an option she could live with. The reality of the lift was more difficult to accept. Roslyn had yet another surgery to lengthen her leg and is only a few days from finishing the process.

Through it all, there were people who have been the hands & feet of Jesus to Roslyn. People who checked on her when she was in the hospital, others who made frequent calls & visits once she was home and provided meals, those who listened when she was frustrated and in pain, and many who prayed for her.

So, how can we effectively minister to those around us who are on a journey of recovery? What can we do to support them as they endure pain, isolation, and yes, boredom?

Have you ever said "if you need anything please let me know"? Did you mean it? We should all have those we can call upon when we need help. And if we offer help, we must be ready to step up to provide help when it is needed.

Have you thought "I should call, but they may be sleeping, I don't want to bother them"? Perhaps God is directing you to call at their moment of greatest need. Make the call, if you get voicemail leave a message, let them know God put them on your mind, and that you are praying for them.
