Hello, we'd like you to come to our kickoff party that is from 7:00pm to 8:00pm on Wednesday, July 1st at Trinity Baptist



#### Staff Spotlight Frank Brooksher "A Late Calling"

From the time I was 6 years old I can remember going to church. Usually I was taken with a younger sister and dropped off at a Baptist church in our neighborhood. When

I was 15 years old I accepted Christ as Lord of my life at a James Robison youth revival. I was baptized in the same church I grew up in, but with no youth group I reverted back to a "worldly attitude"

I joined the Houston Police Department right out of college in 1968. That same year I married my precious wife Judy and the following year our daughter Tanya was born. My wife who was raised Catholic accepted Christ after we had been married for 4 years and became the spiritual leader of our family. I was busy working long hours and numerous extra jobs to have all the good things I thought we needed as a family.

As a police officer I was always quick to judge others and it was no different when I was around Christians that Judy associated with. I would sometimes attend church with her but felt more comfortable around other police officers.

In 1992 I felt a desire to move my family from the big city rat race and head to Colorado to escape the madness. I retired in February 1993 from HPD and accepted a position with an assignment in Estes Park Colorado. My family and I started attending Estes Park Baptist Church and I began to be stirred by the Holy Spirit.

One day my Pastor asked to visit with me. He asked me to start praying about how God could use me to serve others in ways outside law enforcement. That night while laying in bed, I began to pray. I distinctly remember the Holy Spirit tell me that it was time to serve Him and walk down a righteous path in my life. From that moment forth the most important thing was turning my life back over to Him.

I retired from law enforcement after 33 years and left the cold winters of Estes Park and moved to Kerrville in January of 2000. I left behind my Bible Study teacher. Bob Risch, that had the most influence in my life about how to serve the Lord. He mentored and taught me in so many ways I could not count.

In 2000 Judy and I joined Trinity Baptist Church. As a deacon I knew that being obedient to God in loving service to others was what I enjoyed the most. In May of 2015 Pastor John asked me to pray about becoming a pastoral care minister. Instantly, God spoke to me and said this ministry was where He wanted me. Sharron Hawk, and I began to reach out to individuals and families in our church and the community and we have been blessed to lead a team of dedicated volunteers at Trinity for the last 5 years. We could tell endless stories about the love of Christ at work in our lives and the lives of those to whom we minister

Just when Sharron and I thought we had a handle on our ministry, things changed overnight. I remember going to Peterson Regional hospital in early March, 2020 to pray with a church member, when I was met at the front door by hospital staff and refused admittance because of the Covid-19 pandemic sweeping the world. Though the methods change the mission continues. I will continue to praise the One who is Holy and Righteous until He calls me home.

Before the pandemic we would average 150-200 viewing our streamed services. That number increased to about 1,000 weekly viewers, which doesn't include those watching via For me, the greatest reward was to be part of sharing God's Youtube. You might be interested to know our streamed Word in a hands-on way. We've certainly had some bumps services reach as far as Russia and China.

Typically, we use teams of 5 volunteers for each streamed worship service. But with the social distancing mandate came the need to reduce our number of people on campus. While we can accomplish streaming with only one volunteer it's quite stressful, and the opportunity to change camera angles is non-existent. With careful scheduling we managed to use a minimum number of volunteers and accomplish the

Streaming our Mid-Week Bible Study has been really exciting. We began using the green screen to utilize a different background. Fine tuning the settings in order to present a good quality video was challenging and rewarding when it all came together. Recording, editing, and finalizing the video is about a 5-hour process for a 1 hour service.

Trinity has been streaming services for several years now, I can't say enough about our amazing volunteers, they range but when churches all across the nation began streaming on in age from 8 to 90! One team is completely made up of Sunday mornings we began to experience an issue with children. Social distancing is still having an effect, especially bandwidth, which caused our streaming to glitch or freeze. for our older volunteers, but their earnest desire to be here is We worked to resolve the issue by adding Youtube as an evident. Since we are now streaming all three of our services, we have a number of volunteers working on multiple teams. I'm anxious for the day when everyone can feel confident returning to church.


