



Have you ever been asked to do something that challenges you, terrifies you, thrills you and gives you deep moments of joy---all at the same time? No, I'm not talking about riding The Rattler at Six Flags! But similar: Teaching children's Sunday School at Trinity is an exciting ride that lasts only 50 minutes and leaves us breathless at the end and curiously eager to get back on for the next Sunday!

What a privilege to look into those tender trusting eyes of my third grade class and realize that God has called us all together in that space to learn more about Him. I am officially the teacher, but it's accurately been said that "the teacher is the student". I come prepared with the lesson and other study materials and think I know how our time will unfold. But, of course, the class belongs to God and the Holy Spirit often takes us into another direction, depending on the needs of the children who walk in the door. 

I don't even like the word "exercise," and have been on a search for something sustainable, knowing the choice is largely mine as to how I choose to go through the inevitable aging process. There seems to be, as with most change, a ripple effect. Our church has been sharing the Sunday morning flowers for many years. Every Sunday our church has a flower arrangement in memory of or in honor of a loved one in A beautiful tribute to someone their lives. important in the lives of our church family. On Sunday, the flowers are watered again to keep them fresh. Why, you wonder? On Monday mornings the ladies in the Flower Ministry gather to rearrange the altar flowers in order to share a bit of this love and joy with others. New, smaller arrangements are made to share with our congregation in the hospitals and nursing or assisted living centers. Sometimes they are shared with others experiencing a difficult time in life, released from the hospital or celebrating a major life event. flowers are delivered, we visit briefly with those receiving them, often praying with them and sharing God's love and ours. We pray as God leads us for their individual situation. If they are not home, (yes, we call) we leave the flowers at the office for them or deliver them

later in the week.

We maintain a written log to ensure they are shared with many. Before we deliver the flowers, we pray. We pray in thanksgiving for the gift of the flowers, to be able to share the flowers and the joy of rearranging them. We pray for those receiving the love gift, for their health, their spirit and that the flowers may brighten their life and remind them of God's love, as well as the love our church has to share with them.

I just recently joined this group. However, others have served for many years. In the past, I even visited with them as they rearranged the flowers and set off to deliver them. What an amazing ministry that shares the gift of the flowers for the congregation on Sunday morning in church and then shares them with members of our

### GriefShare by Pattie Davis

GriefShare is a biblically-based support group "designed to help and encourage persons after the death of a spouse, child, family member or friend" on their journey through their loss to regain equilibrium and move toward healing, hope, and joy.

Each meeting features a video, group discussion, and the use of a personal workbook. The 30-minute videos feature "comments and suggestions by experts in dealing with loss, personal stories of people who are grieving, and enactments of how various individuals have confronted their own situation."

The group discussions, which are completely confidential, offer participants the opportunity to talk about what they heard, to ask any questions they may have, or to learn how something shown in the video or expressed in the discussion by others in the group might apply to their own life.

The workbook has questions, suggestions, and Bible verses which help each person learn how to cope with their loss. For instance, a question or suggestion from the book might offer a new approach to address their loss. Others find their involvement to be a source of comfort or encouragement as they actively participate.

Many people find that grief is a very complex subject and that their needs and solutions may be quite different from those of fellow participants. In sharing one's individual story, someone else might find something that really encourages them. GriefShare is a group of folks on a similar journey, helping themselves while helping each other. It is one of the smaller "communities" we have within our Body of Christ here at Trinity, as participants grow to feel like family.

The next 13-week cycle of Grief-Share will begin on Monday, September 9<sup>th</sup> and end December 2<sup>nd</sup>. If you would like more information, please contact one of the following persons: Truett Barfield, Pattie Davis, Dawna Hill, or Doug Lusk.

We maintain a written log to ensure they are shared with many. Before we deliver the flowers, we pray. We pray in thanksgiving for the gift of the flowers, to be able to share the flowers and the joy of rearranging them. We pray for those receiving the love gift, for their health, their spirit and that the flowers may brighten their life and remind them of God's love, as well as the love our church has to share with them.

### GriefShare by Pattie Davis

GriefShare is a biblically-based support group "designed to help and encourage persons after the death of a spouse, child, family member or friend" on their journey through their loss to regain equilibrium and move toward healing, hope, and joy.

Each meeting features a video, group discussion, and the use of a personal workbook. The 30-minute videos feature "comments and suggestions by experts in dealing with loss, personal stories of people who are grieving, and enactments of how various individuals have confronted their own situation."

The group discussions, which are completely confidential, offer participants the opportunity to talk about what they heard, to ask any questions they may have, or to learn how something shown in the video or expressed in the discussion by others in the group might apply to their own life.

The workbook has questions, suggestions, and Bible verses which help each person learn how to cope with their loss. For instance, a question or suggestion from the book might offer a new approach to address their loss. Others find their involvement to be a source of comfort or encouragement as they actively participate.

Many people find that grief is a very complex subject and that their needs and solutions may be quite different from those of fellow participants. In sharing one's individual story, someone else might find something that really encourages them. GriefShare is a group of folks on a similar journey, helping themselves while helping each other. It is one of the smaller "communities" we have within our Body of Christ here at Trinity, as participants grow to feel like family.

## Flower Ministry by Sharon Grimes

Our church has been sharing the Sunday morning flowers for many years. Every Sunday our church has a flower arrangement in memory of or in honor of a loved one in A beautiful tribute to someone their lives. important in the lives of our church family. On Sunday, the flowers are watered again to keep them fresh. Why, you wonder? On Monday mornings the ladies in the Flower Ministry gather to rearrange the altar flowers in order to share a bit of this love and joy with others. New, smaller arrangements are made to share with our congregation in the hospitals and nursing or assisted living centers. Sometimes they are shared with others experiencing a difficult time in life, released from the hospital or celebrating a major life event. flowers are delivered, we visit briefly with those receiving them, often praying with them and sharing God's love and ours. We pray as God leads us for their individual situation. If they are not home, (yes, we call) we leave the flowers at the office for them or deliver them

later in the week.

We maintain a written log to ensure they are shared with many. Before we deliver the flowers, we pray. We pray in thanksgiving for the gift of the flowers, to be able to share the flowers and the joy of rearranging them. We pray for those receiving the love gift, for their health, their spirit and that the flowers may brighten their life and remind them of God's love, as well as the love our church has to share with them.

I just recently joined this group. However, others have served for many years. In the past, I even visited with them as they rearranged the flowers and set off to deliver them. What an amazing ministry that shares the gift of the flowers for the congregation on Sunday morning in church and then shares them with members of our

church during the week.

### GriefShare by Pattie Davis

GriefShare is a biblically-based support group "designed to help and encourage persons after the death of a spouse, child, family member or friend" on their journey through their loss to regain equilibrium and move toward healing, hope, and joy.

Each meeting features a video, group discussion, and the use of a personal workbook. The 30-minute videos feature "comments and suggestions by experts in dealing with loss, personal stories of people who are grieving, and enactments of how various individuals have confronted their own situation."

The group discussions, which are completely confidential, offer participants the opportunity to talk about what they heard, to ask any questions they may have, or to learn how something shown in the video or expressed in the discussion by others in the group might apply to their own life.

The workbook has questions, suggestions, and Bible verses which help each person learn how to cope with their loss. For instance, a question or suggestion from the book might offer a new approach to address their loss. Others find their involvement to be a source of comfort or encouragement as they actively participate.

Many people find that grief is a very complex subject and that their needs and solutions may be quite different from those of fellow participants. In sharing one's individual story, someone else might find something that really encourages them. GriefShare is a group of folks on a similar journey, helping themselves while helping each other. It is one of the smaller "communities" we have within our Body of Christ here at Trinity, as participants grow to feel like family.
