
there. There is a plaque memorializing both this place and these godly men. We will not forget.

# Friendship Bible Study Class by Melinda Cox

The Friendship Class at Trinity is a Bible Study Class that enjoys delving in depth into the previous week's sermon passage of the Bible, although on occasion we study other Biblical topics. After the lesson has been presented, prayer requests are solicited from the group and those requests are then prayed over before being sent out to the class via email so the needs can be prayed over during the week.
